Language: The language of instruction will be English, with non-simultaneous Russian translation.

Purpose: The purpose of this group workshop is to provide participants with onsite demonstration/explanation of the application of various remediation technologies utilised to address the issues specific to a site and/or the type of residues contained at the site.

Expected Output(s): The main expected outputs of the group workshop are:

- Increased knowledge about the various possible technological options for remediation and their long-term implications
- Exposure to remediation works in progress and completed

Scope and Nature: The group workshop will consist of a visit of a few uranium production legacy sites remediated, maintained or otherwise under the control of the US DoE. It will also include a site description, explanation of the technology applied, and long-term significance thereof.

Background Information: The production of nuclear materials has left a legacy of large amounts of radioactive residues in some countries. Member States are now attempting to

address these legacy contaminated sites. The overall objective of this project is to support the safe management and assist in the preparation for remediation of former uranium exploration and exploitation sites within the European Region.

This group workshop will provide an opportunity to see remediation activities in process or in completion.

Participation: The workshop is open to 30 participants. The target countries are: Bulgaria, Czech Republic, Estonia, Hungary, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Romania, Russian Federation, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Tajikistan, Ukraine, United States of America and Uzbekistan

Participants' Qualifications: The participants should be specialists working in the applications of remediation technologies and processes. Furthermore, participants should have higher education in a field relevant to the above, be professionals from governmental authorities or supporting organizations involved remediation programmes.

Selected participants from countries eligible to receive technical assistance will be provided with a round trip economy class air ticket from their home countries to Denver, USA, and a Daily Subsistence Allowance (DSA) at the prevailing UN Rate. Shipment of accumulated workshop materials to the participants' home countries is not the responsibility of the IAEA.

The organizers of the workshop do not accept liability for the payment of any cost or compensation that may arise from damage to or loss of personal property, or from illness, injury, disability or death of a participant while he/she is travelling to and from or attending the workshop, and it is clearly understood that each Government, in nominating participants, undertakes responsibility for such coverage. Governments would be well advised to take out insurance against these risks.
