- Language:** The language of instruction will be English.
- Purpose:** The purpose of the training course is to introduce the participants to advanced statistical tools for identification of sources of air pollution and for apportionment of their contribution, based on the results of compositional characterization of Air Particulate Matter.
- Scope and Nature:** The training course consists of lectures, demonstrations with previous case studies and practical exercises.
- Participation:** The training course is open to participants from IAEA Member States in the region of Europe, one from each of the countries participating in the RER/1/013 project.
- The course is targeted to participants from Albania, Azerbaijan, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Georgia,

Greece, Hungary, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Moldova, Montenegro, Poland, Portugal, Serbia, Slovakia, Slovenia, Tajikistan, The Former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia, and Turkey.

**Participants’
Qualifications:**

Candidates should be specialists involved in air pollution studies, in particular dealing with Air Particulate Matter (APM) and preferably having already acquired information on elemental characterization of APM.

As the training course will be conducted in English, participants should have sufficient proficiency to follow lectures and express themselves in this language without difficulty.

**Nomination
procedure:**

Nominations should be submitted to the IAEA online through the Technical Cooperation Department’s InTouch system (<http://intouch.iaea.org>). Should this not be possible, nominations may be submitted on the standard IAEA Application Form for Training Courses (available on the IAEA website: <http://www.iaea.org/>). Completed forms should be endorsed by relevant national authorities and returned to the Agency through the official channels, i.e. the designated National Liaison Office for IAEA Matters.

The completed nomination forms should be sent to the Programme Management Officer for this project, Mr. Mykola Kurylchuk, through IAEA Official Fax (+43-1-26007) or E-Mail (Official.Mail@iaea.org), not later than **10 April 2014**. Nominations received after this date or which have not been routed through the established official channels cannot be considered.

**Administrative
and financial
arrangements:**

Nominating Governments will be informed in due course of the names of the selected candidates and will at that time be given full details on the procedures to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.

During their attendance at the course, participants from countries eligible to receive technical assistance will be provided by the IAEA with a stipend sufficient to cover the cost of their accommodation, food, and minor incidental expenses. The IAEA will also provide the participants with a round-trip economy class air ticket from their home countries to **Sacavem (Lisbon)**, Portugal and return. Shipment of accumulated course materials to the participants’ home countries is not the responsibility of the IAEA.

The organizers of the Course do not accept liability for the payment of any cost or compensation that may arise from damage to or loss of personal property, or from illness, injury, disability or death of a participant while he/she is travelling to and from or attending the course, and it is clearly understood that each Government, in nominating participants, undertakes responsibility for such coverage. Governments would be well advised to take out insurance against these risks.
