Purpose:	The purpose of the Regional Training Course is to: a) provide guidance on issues relevant to the radiation protection of workers and the public involved in mining, processing and disposal of raw materials containing Naturally Occurring Radioactive Material (NORM) b) enhance participants' awareness of the protection and safety requirements of the International Basis Safety Standards (BSS) in occupational exposures with particular focus on NORM c) enhance participants knowledge on the type of activities involving NORM that are most likely to require regulatory consideration and to provide guidance on the application of a graded system of regulatory control over NORM c) support participants to initiate appropriate national training programmes
Expected Output(s):	The expected output for the course will be: 1) Trained experts on radiation protection on NORM 2) Country profiles on radiation protection on NORM in the participating Member States
Scope and Nature:	The course will consist of a series of lectures, information exchange among participants, group discussion, and technical visits.

Background Information:	This training course is organized within the regional TC project RER/9/128 on <i>Strengthening National Capabilities for Radiological Protection of Workers and Occupational Exposure Control</i> . The objective of the project is to develop and further strengthen capabilities concerning the protection of health and the safety of radiation workers occupationally exposed to ionizing radiation, including harmonization of the implementation of IAEA standards in the area of occupational radiation protection.
Participation:	The training course is open to 25 participants from Member States in the TC Europe region.
Participants' Qualifications:	The training course is targeted towards individuals with radiation protection responsibilities in both operation and regulation of radiological aspects of industries handling naturally occurring radioactive materials (NORM) and the implementation of necessary control measures. Participants are required to have sufficient working knowledge of English language.

Shipment of accumulated training course materials to the participants' home countries is not the responsibility of the IAEA.</p> <p>The organizers of the training course do not accept liability for the payment of any cost or compensation that may arise from damage to or loss of personal property, or from illness, injury, disability or death of a participant while he/she is travelling to and from or attending the training course, and it is clearly understood that each Government, in nominating participants, undertakes responsibility for such coverage. Governments would be well advised to take out insurance against these risks.</p>
