I am pleased to inform you that the International Atomic Energy Agency (IAEA) is organizing the above event under the IAEA technical cooperation project RER9143, "Enhancing Radioactive Waste Management Capabilities".

Information Sheet

Purpose

The purpose of the event is to discuss radioactive waste management capabilities by enhancing stakeholders mutual understanding and cooperation on decision making for management of RADON-type facilities in the light of the IAEA Safety Standards.

Working Language(s)

The working language(s) of the event will be Russian.

Deadline for Nominations

Nominations received after 20 September 2019 will not be considered.

Scope and Nature

The workshop is intended to cover all activities associated with the disposal of radioactive waste that need to be authorised (licensed) and for which safety assessment(s) should be performed and safety case developed and reviewed. The aim of the workshop is to exchange information and experience on regulatory review of the safety case and safety assessment(s) for disposal of radioactive waste. The workshop will focus on: (i) Safety Standards on management of radioactive waste;(ii) Safety Standards on Safety Case and Safety Assessment;(iii) Practical experience in decision making, approaches used for it, and activities performed for radioactive waste retrieval from previously constructed and operated disposal facilities, management of retrieved waste;(iv) Lessons learned. Discussion is planned on the existing practices and procedures for radioactive waste management and decision making for management of post-practice and operated RADON-type facilities, approaches and methodologies used for decision making, techniques used for waste retrieval and farther management of retrieved waste. The workshop will consist of presentations provided by invited experts, who will moderate discussion between participants on highlighted issues and national cases. Participants will present their experience and issues encountered on decision making regarding RADON-type facilities and retrieval of radioactive waste from them.

Participants' Qualifications and Experience

The participants should be specialists in radioactive waste management. They should be decision makers, regulators, supporting institutions involved in safety assessment or practical implementation decisions made, in particular, retrieval of radioactive waste from past-practice RADON-type facilities; or they could be specialists involved into development of safety standards and authorisation procedures for such activities; or they could also be operators of RADON-type facilities.

Application Procedure

Candidates wishing to apply for this event should follow the steps below:

1. Access the IAEA TALEO page (https://iaea.taleo.net/careersection/ex/jobsearch.ftl) and complete the Candidate Profile.

- 2. Be registered on the Nucleus page of the IAEA (https://nucleus.iaea.org/).
- 3. Through Nucleus, access the InTouch+ platform where the Profile is completed (My Profile tab) (https://nucleus.iaea.org/Pages/InTouchPlus.aspx).

NOTE: The email used for TALEO and Nucleus must be the same. If not, the candidate's profile will not appear complete.

- 4. On the InTouch + platform, under the 'My InTouch +' tab, the candidate needs to:
 - a. select the institute / organization that he/she works at / represents ('My Institute' section);
 - b. click on the link called 'Refresh Personal History Form' to update the system, otherwise the nominations submitted will have these fields empty and it will not be possible to evaluate them during the selection of candidates ('IAEA Recruitment Platform' section).

NOTE: Once the above steps are finalized, the candidate's profile will appear as completed and he/she can apply for Technical Cooperation events.

5. In the InTouch+ platform (https://intouchplus.iaea.org), in the 'Applications' tab, search by the event number provided in the invitation.

Applications should contain sufficient information to establish that the nominees have the required qualifications. Please note that the information regarding LANGUAGE SKILLS, EDUCATION AND WORK EXPERIENCE is exported from TALEO. If an applicant's profile in TALEO is not updated, the information in INTOUCH+ for these sections appears as empty and the candidates cannot be evaluated. Completed applications need to be endorsed by the relevant national authority, i.e. the National Liaison Office and submitted through the established official channels.

Administrative and Financial Arrangements

Nominating authorities will be informed in due course of the names of the candidates who have been selected, and will at that time be informed of the procedure to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.

Selected participants will receive an allowance from the IAEA sufficient to cover their costs of lodging, daily subsistence and miscellaneous expenses. They will also receive either a round-trip air ticket based on the most direct and economical route between the airport nearest their residence and the airport nearest the duty station through the IAEA's travel agency American Express, or a travel grant, or they will be reimbursed travel by car/bus/train in accordance with IAEA rules for non-staff travel.

Disclaimer of Liability

The organizers of the event do not accept liability for the payment of any cost or compensation that may arise from damage to or loss of personal property, or from illness, injury, disability or death of a participant while he/she is travelling to and from or attending the course, and it is clearly understood that each Government, in approving his/her participation, undertakes responsibility for such coverage. Governments would be well advised to take out insurance against these risks.

Note for female participants

Any woman engaged by the IAEA for work or training should notify the IAEA on becoming aware that she is pregnant.

The Board of Governors of the IAEA approved new International Basic Safety Standards for Protection against Ionizing Radiation and for the Safety of Radiation Sources. The Standards deal specifically with the occupational exposure conditions of female workers by requiring, inter alia, that a female worker should, on becoming aware that she is pregnant, notify her employer in order that her working conditions may be modified, if necessary. This notification shall not be considered a reason to exclude her from work; however, her working conditions, with respect to occupational exposure shall be adapted with a view to ensuring that her embryo or foetus be afforded the same broad level of protection as required for members of the public.
