## **Purpose**

The purpose of the virtual event is to review the first joint database on radon risk communication results.

## Working Language(s)

The working language of the event will be English.

#### **Deadline for Nominations**

Nominations received after 5 March 2021 will not be considered.

#### **Project Background**

The virtual workshop is organized in the frame of regional project RER9153: Enhancing the regional capacity to control the long-term risks to the public due to radon in dwellings and at workplace;. STEAM methodology is related to a special task within the regional project RER153 with the objective to create and apply a questionnaire to evaluate general knowledge on radon among different stakeholders, and to address the means of preferred communication.

#### **Scope and Nature**

During the workshop, the Member States applying STEAM methodology will merge national results into one joint database. This will allow for improved statistical analysis and reduce uncertainties. The issue on cultural influence on radon risk perception will be discussed and adjusted.

## **Participation**

The event is open for the participants of STEAM project only.

Kindly note that this virtual workshop is a follow up meeting to the Virtual Event - Regional Workshop on Joined Radon Population Opinion Survey- Share Team up Engage Analyse Monitor (STEAM) – RER9153-1907199, which took place from 15 to 17 December 2020. Therefore, only the candidates of that meeting as per attached list are eligible to participate. Should the participants of RER9153-1907199 not be available for the follow-up meeting, so the Member State can consider nominating another representative from the same institute.

## Participants' Qualifications and Experience

National results of STEAM questionnaire must be analysed according to instructions and training obtained in December 2020; the descriptive part of statistics on national level must be presented by participants.

#### **Application Procedure**

Candidates wishing to apply for this event should follow the steps below:

- 1. Access the InTouch+ home page (<a href="https://intouchplus.iaea.org">https://intouchplus.iaea.org</a>) using the candidate's existing Nucleus username and password. If the candidate is not a registered Nucleus user, she/he must create a Nucleus account (<a href="https://websso.iaea.org/IM/UserRegistrationPage.aspx">https://websso.iaea.org/IM/UserRegistrationPage.aspx</a>) before proceeding with the event application process below.
- 2. On the InTouch + platform, the candidate must:

- a. Finalize or update her/his personal details, provide sufficient information to establish the required qualifications regarding education, language skills and work experience ('Profile' tab) and upload relevant supporting documents;
- b. Search for the relevant technical cooperation event (EVT2100444) under the 'My Eligible Events' tab, answer the mandatory questions and lastly submit the application to the required authority.

**NOTE:** Completed applications need to be approved by the relevant national authority, i.e. the National Liaison Office, and submitted to the IAEA through the established official channels by the provided designation deadline.
