Information Sheet

Purpose

The purpose of the event is to train participants on safety cases and safety assessments for the predisposal management of radioactive waste.

Working Language(s)

The working language(s) of the event will be English.

Deadline for Nominations

Nominations received after 11 June 2021 will not be considered.

Participation

The event is open to the Member States participating in project INT9186 that are developing or have operating facilities for predisposal management of radioactive waste. Participants should comply with the profile described in Participants' Qualifications. When sending applications, Member States are expected to specify clearly the priority of their applicants. Preference will be given to Member States which are newly participating in the series of Cradle to Grave projects and/or have made limited progress in developing safety cases and performing safety assessments.

Participants' Qualifications and Experience

Participants should be staff working with safety assessment and safety cases for predisposal management of radioactive waste requiring further training and experience in radioactive waste management. Participants may be from waste management operators, regulatory bodies, technical support organizations or other organizations conducting research in support of safety assessments for radioactive waste management.

Application Procedure

Candidates wishing to apply for this event should follow the steps below:

- Access the InTouch+ home page (<u>https://intouchplus.iaea.org</u>) using the candidate's existing Nucleus username and password. If the candidate is not a registered Nucleus user, she/he must create a Nucleus account (<u>https://websso.iaea.org/IM/UserRegistrationPage.aspx</u>) before proceeding with the event application process below.
- 2. On the InTouch + platform, the candidate must:
 - a. Finalize or update her/his personal details, provide sufficient information to establish the required qualifications regarding education, language skills and work experience ('Profile'

tab) and upload relevant supporting documents;

b. Search for the relevant technical cooperation event (EVT2002807) under the 'My Eligible Events' tab, answer the mandatory questions and lastly submit the application to the required authority.

NOTE: Completed applications need to be approved by the relevant national authority, i.e. the National Liaison Office, and submitted to the IAEA through the established official channels by the provided designation deadline.

NOTE: A medical certificate signed by a registered medical practitioner dated not more than four months prior to starting date of the event must be submitted by candidates when applying for a) events with a duration exceeding one month, and/or b) all candidates over the age of 65 regardless of the event duration.

Nominating authorities will be informed in due course of the names of the candidates who have been selected, and will at that time be informed of the procedure to be followed with regard to administrative and financial matters.

Participants whose nomination has been endorsed by their National Liaison Officer and who indicate their need, will receive a financial support to compensate their costs for internet connection for the duration of the event in line with IAEA rules and procedures.
